	<p>Provide a short description that uniquely identifies the proposed action and its location.</p> <p>The construction of pipeline and associated works to create a single water supply scheme which will deliver water from a storage facility in Greenbushes to the towns of Balingup, Mullalyup and Kirup. The project area is primarily made up of a pipeline corridor approximately 16 km long, with an average width of less than 10 m. The project area is located 230 km south of Perth and 50 km south of Bunbury.</p> <p>Much of the project area occurs along existing gravel tracks which were created as a result of previous infrastructure development (e.g. road, water and railway). The total Project area is 15.3 hectares, of which 5.8 ha contains native vegetation</p>
