Sea wrack accumulates periodically on Rockingham beaches annually following summer and winter storm surge events. The City has received ongoing requests for the removal of sea wrack due to the unpleasant odour caused by the sea wrack decomposing and the reduced visual amenity and useability of the beaches within close proximity to Tern island and Waikiki ramp (please see attached maps). These areas are situated adjacent to the Shoalwater Marine Park, above the low water mark at spring tides and is therefore under the management of the City of Rockingham. The City would like to apply for a special purpose permit to remove accumulated sea wrack within the nominated areas to provide residents within the area better accessibility to these sections of beaches.
