APA is proposing to remove Condition 7(a). A survey has already been done in 2020 as part of this condition. APA did not feel this survey reduced the risk to fauna further by doing a survey 3 weeks prior to clearing. Given APA will have a fauna spotter at the time of clearing, the Company feels the cost is disproportionate to the environmental benefit gained. With the use of a spotter under condition 7(d) at the time of clearing, APA feels the risk is mitigated to species of conservation significance.
