Therefore, it is proposed to not continue with this road realignment, being the option with the least amount of impact. Due to the extremely narrow width of Neds Corner Rd and nature of it being a heavy haulage route during harvest, a minimum of 28 m is required to complete the road reconstruction. Therefore the Shire wishes to continue working towards approval for 28 m width road footprint, whilst mitigating impact as much as feasible. In summary, there are multiple amendments needing to the permit. These are outlined below: the physical area of the permit is amended to remove one of the road realignments, as this is the pathway with the least amount of impact. A shapefile is attached with the new amended area. The total permitted clearing is amended from 5.56 ha within a 15.34 ha area, to 5.53 ha within a 15.31 ha area. Approval to take an additional two plants (one plant present in the current road footprint at CPS 8400/1e and the one plant in the proposed realignment area at CPS 8400/1g).
