The City of Swan recently obtained a clearing permit to undertake drainage upgrade works along Jenkins Road in Bullsbrook to address localised ponding issues. Following receipt of the clearing permit, the City has revised the scope and area of our proposed works. At the time of the original application, the City's works were limited to the eastern verge, however, following review, we are now looking to extend the works to include the western verge as well. These changes were proposed in order to drain the water more effectively away from the ponding area on the eastern side of Jenkins Road (this is the low side). - Proposed method of clearing: excavator and bobcat - Purpose of the clearing: installation of drainage to address an adjacent road ponding issue as this is a safety hazard for road users - Period within which the clearing is proposed to be undertaken: November 2020 to December 2020						
- Final land use: road reserve Please find attached a concept plan showing our revised design and map showing our proposed clearing area. The total area to be cleared is estimated to be approximately 743.42 sqm, equating to approximately 0.074 ha.						
We note that the approved area of clearing in the current permit is 0.264 ha which we believe may have been a typo and should instead be 0.026 ha. This was confirmed to be an error by DWER via email on Thursday, 18/6/20 – please find attached email correspondence and amend accordingly.
