North West Quarries Pty Ltd are the mining tenement holders of the land (M47/1495) and have formally occupied the site since 31 st October 2014, when the tenement was transferred from Quarrytech Consulting Pty Ltd to North West Quarries Pty Ltd. The site's clearing permit is currently CPS 6262/1, expiring in November 2019. This clearing permit application is for an identical area to CPS 6262/1, the only difference being the change in permit holder.

The Mundabullangana Station owner and manager (Mr Michael Thompson) is aware of North West Quarries Pty Ltd's ongoing mining activities at the site and has previously provided written consent for access to M47/1495. The written confirmation was provided with the previous clearing permit application for the site and is also attached. Per the written consent to access the land (dated 31 st August 2014), the change of ownership of M47/1495 transferred all terms of the access to the new owner. Mike is aware that it is North West Quarries Pty Ltd whom has been and will continue to access the site.

of, the proposed clearing of native vegetation.	Minimisation of the clearing area occurred prior to the original clearing permit application (CPS 6262/1). The majority of the 52.51 hectares of clearing area comprise the sand dune and river bed footprints (combined area of 47.08 hectares). The remaining 5.43 hectares is associated with support facilities, roads and topsoil stockpile locations as described in Section 4 of the attached CPS 2019 application document.									
	Clearing is undertaken progressively and only immediately in advance of the area being required. At all times, North West Quarries aim to limit the open footprint. The total current ground disturbance at the site, due to the sand mining being in its infancy still, is a small 8.0759 hectares. Where possible, North West Quarries have utilised existing pastoral roads and tracks, with the consent of the pastoralist, in lieu of clearing additional corridors. This has resulted in both minimising the ground disturbance footprint at the site and the protection of the Eucalyptus camaldulensis trees and their root systems on the river bank.									
	The realisation of the sand dune and river bed disturbance footprints will occur as sand mining at the site progresses. At this time, the direct haul road will be required for the transport of river sand to the lower laydown.
