of, the proposed clearing of native vegetation.	The northern section of Sandy Cape Road currently has two almost right-angle bends in it. Sandy Cape Road leads to Sandy Cape campground and the Shire needs to make the road safer for campground users. In addition, emergency vehicles (fire engines, ambulances etc) might need to access the campground area and the Shire needs to reduce the angle on the bends to make them safer. The Shire has minimised the area to be cleared as much as possible while considering road safety and emergency vehicle access. The Shire will rehabilitate 0.11 ha of the current road alignment once the new alignment has been constructed. When the new road alignment has been completed the Shire will rip the old section of the road alignment, that will not be used any more, and will place plant material/brush removed from the new alignment onto the ripped areas.
