Purpose of clearing

The Rottnest Island Authority is seeking to resurface roads within the settlement area on Rottnest Island. The resurfacing project is part of on-going maintenance of the Islands infrastructure. As part of the resurfacing activity the Rottnest Island Authority require a mobile asphalt plant to manufacture asphalt.

The proposed clearing is required for the placement and operation of the mobile asphalt plant (6 weeks duration) on the Island.

There will be no clearing required for the road resurfacing.

	If yes, provide details: The RIA have reviewed a number of sites within the Settlement Area which have been previously cleared. Areas that have been previously cleared are currently in use for other activities, close in proximity to sensitive receptors or areas requiring excessive excavation to gain level ground. In reviewing areas to be cleared the RIA completed a constraints mapping exercise. The constraints reviewed included: within the zoned settlement area, vegetation condition, location to sensitive receptors, access and proximity to areas of roads to be resurfaced. A total of 6 sites were reviewed in the selection process and the details of each are provided in the supporting documentation provided attachment 2. Management mitigation and definition of the scale of the proposed clearing is provided in the supporting documentation provided attachment 2.
