The City of Swan subsequently engaged a consultant to conduct a detailed inspection on the tree/hollows. This inspection was conducted on 16/04/2020 through the use of a camera mounted on a telescopic pole, which enabled the capture of several close up images of the hollows. The inspection findings were that the hollows were no longer suitable as a Black Cockatoo breeding habitat, as the hollow had completed rotted out on one side and there were no chew marks in the wood. In addition, the tree containing the hollows showed extensive termite damage and appeared to be dead. The tree also appears to currently be supported by an understorey sapling (which if removed could cause the tree to fall anyway). In light of this information, the City of Swan would like Conditions 3, 4, 5(b) and 5(c) removed from the approved Clearing Permit CPS 8802/1 at the earliest convenience of DWER: - Condition 3.
