The location selected was based on the shortest route from Two Rocks Road through Crown land to the beach to lessen the potential for environmental disturbances and the need for vegetation clearing.										
	In addition, the alignment of the beach access road has been redesigned in response to the results of the biological assessments completed, resulting in a reduced number of Priority species that will be cleared as a result of the project, from 36 to 4.
