Western Areas was granted approval for CPS8833/1 on 26 September 2020 for the purposes of mineral exploration on Exploration Licences 77/1581, 77/1734, 77/2235, 77/2236, 77/2261, 77/2440 and 77/2527. The purpose of this mineral exploration was to drill test aerial electromagnetic surveys undertaken in June and July 2018. Environmental guidance for this exploration program was provided by the "Conservation Management Plan for exploration and prospecting within the Jilbadji Nature Reserve on tenements E77/1581, E77/1734, E77/2235, E77/2236, E772440, E77/2261, E77/2527, P77/4475, P77/4476, P77/4477, P77/4478, P77/4479, Version 2, 14 February 2019". The program was divided into Phases One and Two. Phase One has mostly been completed. Phase Two has yet to be completed.

Some tracks that were previously cleared and therefore not included in the application for CPS8833/1 have since experienced some regrowth. This amendment includes those tracks on E77/2440, E77/1581, E77/1734, E77/2235 and E77/2261 that require clearing along the edges.

Total area of regrowth clearing proposed is 2.15 ha.

In addition, disturbance is required for a further exploration program (Parts 1 and 2) (proposed from July 2022 to July 2023):

Part 1 - recent data compilations and reviews have revealed nickel in soil anomalies on E77/2228. Drill tests are required to examine those anomalisms. Access to E77/2228 will be via E77/2440. Amount of clearing proposed (access, drill pads and sumps) is 4.62 ha as outlined in the following table.
