In addition to the improvement section under the State Black Spot Program the Shire wish to include 19.35 to 19.93 which is aimed as mulching of the road shoulders to improve vision to the intersection of Nanga Brook Road and Nanga Road. The initial scope of the road verges identified fifteen mature native trees of the Allocasurina Fraseriana, Banksia Grandis, Corymbia Calophylla and Eucalyptus Marginata varieties which require removal due to their location falling within one to five metre clear zone around curves. The remainder of the clearing will involve machine mulching of verges which would be at a width of 2.4 metres from the edge of the seal on straight sections of the road and a maximum of five metres on curves to ensure the run off onto the shoulders are free of hazards as much as practical.
