## Application for a clearing permit (area permit)

Environmental Protection Act 1986, section 51E

## FORM C1

Clearing of native vegetation is prohibited in Western Australia except where a clearing permit has been granted or an exemption applies. A person who causes or allows unauthorised clearing commits an offence.
