The duration of the permit is proposed to be amended to authorise clearing from 26 January 2022 to 26 January 2024. Amend the size of the area permitted to be cleared under the permit. The size of the area to be cleared is proposed to be increased from 0.89 ha to 1.01 ha. The proposed area of clearing is herein referred to as 'the amendment area'. The amendment area incorporates portions of the approved clearing permit boundary (0.35 ha) subject to translocation of plants only ('translocation only')'. The remaining 0.66 ha reflects the extent of the development footprint required to facilitate the construction of the Centre. The area subject to clearing for the Centre is less than that previously requested, however as translocation has already been undertaken, the translocation area also needs to be included in the permit boundary. Overall, the amount of clearing required to construct the Centre and associated infrastructure is less than the previously approved clearing area. Further rotating the building design to ensure that the majority of the building footprint was located within cleared areas/lower quality vegetation.							

Part 4: Proposed amendments										
	 Locating buildings and infrastructure so that nine of the ten black cockatoo habitat trees can be retained, including two identified as containing potentially suitable hollows. This has increased the retention of black cockatoo trees by an additional two. Whilst the amendment area applies to the entire 1.01 ha, a large proportion of this will not require wholescale clearing. 0.35 ha of this comprises areas that have already been subject to the removal of selected plants for translocation purposes only (as supported by the existing permit). Where possible vegetation, particularly trees within the asset protection zone will be retained. Translocated individuals will be reintroduced to garden areas as part of implementing landscaped areas.

An Offset Proposal has been prepared by Emerge Associates (2020) to counterbalance the significant residual impacts of the clearing and has been approved by the DWER. Under Conditions 6 and 7 of the CPS 8983/1, the permit holder is required to protect and manage 2.17 ha of vegetation in at least 'Very Good' condition within Rose Shanks Reserve (Lot 500 on Plan 413034 - Crown Reserve R 1820) through the changing of the purpose of Rose Shanks Reserve from 'Recreation' to 'Conservation'. This offset requirement has been determined in consultation with DPLH who have provided in principle support (Emerge Associates 2020). The permit holder proposes to retain the same offset commitments as outlined within the approved permit.
