The vegetation clearing represented in this application is the worst case scenario. The Shire will only take out the absolute minimum required as tree removal is an expensive exercise and the more trees removed the less road that can be reconstructed. There is a substantial amount of native vegetation within the road reserve and to limit the impact only vegetation which is within five metres of the edge of the new bitumen seal has been flagged for removal. A surveyor has been engaged to create survey files to pin point the location of the selected vegetation and the tree species have been identified to assist with the assessment of Vegetation Clearing Permit.
