	In areas of low growing non-woody vegetation, vegetation will not be cleared ahead of access but travel will occur on the vegetated surface to minimise ground and vegetation disturbance.								
	In areas where taller shrubs and other woody vegetation cannot be avoided, and the risk of tyre punctures is higher, the vegetation will be cleared ahead of access with a small front end loader using a raised bucket method, which leaves the soil surface and roots largely undisturbed. The cleared vegetation will be placed in windrows along the access route or drill line, to be respread during rehabilitation.
