Part 1: Assessment bilateral agreement

The clearing of native vegetation is prohibited in Western Australia unless a clearing permi has been granted for the clearing or where a permit is not required (either due to a referral determination that one is not needed or because an exemption applies). A person who causes or allows unauthorised clearing commits an offence.

However, the construction of the proposed path section will require the clearing of approximately 5 m² or less of additional native vegetation along with revegetated native plants that do not represent native vegetation in accordance with the definition provided under the <i>Environmental Protection Act 1986</i> . The additional native vegetation that would be cleared comprises scattered individuals of <i>Eragrostis elongata</i> (a grass). In addition, it is noted that at least 0.37 ha of native vegetation that was approved for removal in the initial application has been retained as part of the development of the State Football Centre.
