There are certain times during the day and depending on the Summer & Winter Solstice the suns rays cannot reach many areas of the Valley. The locations chosen were based on optimum sun exposure, close proximity to the masts and panels they will power. Dense areas of trees were avoided and the minimal amount of critical only trees were chosen with consultation with Paul Udinga from DBCA. Trees close to the access tracks were also chosen so there is minimal disturbance. These 3 locations are 50% of the full project going ahead, so the other 3 locations were able to be located as such in order to avoid clearing and minimise disturbance to the adjacent vegetation.
