	<p>Proposed method of clearing:</p> <p>The proposed clearing areas will be surveyed and delineated with flagging tape to avoid any over clearing. Vegetation will be cleared with mechanised machinery; vegetation will then be removed with a loader and stockpiled as growth medium for nearby rehabilitation. The top 150mm of topsoil will also be removed and stockpiled for rehabilitation. Clearing will be undertaken progressively and areas will be cleared incrementally as they are required ie; as the TSF and WRD expand. Open pits will be cleared prior to imminent mining.</p>
	<p>Purpose of clearing:</p> <p>Development of the Kalgoorlie North Gold Project (KNGP) to allow for the construction of an expansion to the existing TSF and WRD and open pit mining. Clearing will also be required for the construction of a processing plant, dams, offices, workshops and other site infrastructure.</p>
