	<p>Provide details of the proposed change(s), and the rationale(s) for it / them.</p> <p>Main Roads was issued with CPS 9168/1 for the clearing required for the construction of a second carriageway on the Bussell Highway (Hutton to Sabina) section.</p> <p>Figure 3 of Schedule 2 of CPS 9168/1 depicts an area cross-hatched orange (colloquially known as Offset Site 7) within which the rehabilitation in accordance with condition 20 of the Permit must occur.</p> <p>Main Roads is seeking an amendment to CPS 9168/1 in respect to the area cross-hatched orange, as shown in Figure 3 of Schedule 2 as this area was reallocated to fulfill the offset requirements of the separately approved Bunbury Outer Ring Road Project.</p> <p>Main Roads proposes that colloquially known 'Offset Site 1' and 'Offset Site 3' replace 'Offset Site 7' as the areas cross-hatched orange in Figure 3 of Schedule 2. Offset Sites 1, 3 and 7 are all located within the Ludlow Tuart Forest, with Offset Sites 1 and 3 located closer to the approved clearing under CPS 9168/1 along Bussell Highway.</p> <p>Main Roads has enclosed spatial data of Offset Sites 1 and 3 with this amendment application to enable DWER to review and update the areas cross-hatched orange on Figure 3, Schedule 2.</p>
