Condition 16 (c) - Within 24 months of the commencement of clearing authorised under this Permit and no later than 1 December 2026, the Permit Holder must: (i) give a conservation covenant issued under section 30B of the Soil and Land Conservation Act 1945, setting aside the revegetated and rehabilitated areas crosshatched green in Figure 1(g) and Figure 1(h) of Schedule 2 for the protection and management of native vegetation in perpetuity; and (ii) provide to the CEO a copy of the executed conservation covenant. Given construction is still underway and the areas requiring revegetation and conservation covenant are still being used by the Project, Main Roads seeks to amend Condition 16(c) such that the conservation covenant process does not have to be completed until 24 months after the finalisation of clearing authorised under this permit. Condition 17(a) - Within 12 months of the commencement of clearing authorised under this Permit, the Permit Holder must submit a Project Rehabilitation Plan to the CEO for
