The project tenement E47/3523 overlies the Mungaroona Range Nature Reserve and the Yandeyarra Aboriginal Reserve. The proposed project does not intercept with the MRNR.</p> <p>Kairos has entered into an entry permit agreement issued under the provisions of the Aboriginal Affairs Planning Authority Act 1972 to undertake exploration activities within the Yandeyarra Indigenous Reserve. Consent to commence activities was granted in April 2018 for a period of 48 months (</p> <p><b>Attachment A</b> Attachment A).</p> <p>Golden Mount, the tenement holder, is a 100% owned subsidiary of Kairos and has given permission for the proponent to enter and access the land for mineral exploration purposes (Attachment B)</p>

	Proposed method of clearing:				
	Clearing is required for the establishment of access tracks, drill pads including cut and fill pads, sumps, trenches and laydown areas. The proposed clearing method will be raised clearing with a bulldozer. This involves setting the blade of the bulldozer above ground level and cutting off vegetation at the stem whilst leaving the root stock and topsoil intact. This approach also removes the need to strip, stockpile and respread topsoil.				
	Disturbed vegetation will be pushed aside and stockpiled along the edge of drill pads and access tracks to permit safe and practical construction access, whilst preserving the vegetation for later respread in rehabilitation activities.
