	The equipment and methods used to conduct the clearing and earthworks will be dependent on the equipment available to the civil contractor. However, it will typically involve the use of heavy equipment such as bobcat, excavator, loader and chainsaws. The approval works area will be clearly demarcated by a surveyor (for example with flagging tape) to provide visual guidance on the clearing extent. Access to the site will be via a track to be demarcated from a point on the Great Eastern Highway Bypass adjacent to Vale road. Services along the access path will be identified, marked and appropriately protected. None of the proposed clearing coincides with known undergroup services.
