Executive Summary

was commissioned by the to undertake a basic flora and vegetation survey for a proposed fence installation along Anstey Keane Dampland, within the City of Armadale. The proposed fence will be installed along portions of Anstey Road to the south, and Skeet Rd and Ranford Rd to the north. The intent of fencing works is to upgrade and replace existing fencing on site, to protect vegetation within the dampland area by preventing unauthorised pedestrian and vehicular traffic. Outcomes of the survey activities will inform a clearing permit application associated with the proposed works.

The survey outcomes confirmed:

- a total of 47 flora species (taxa) from 20 families, of which 30 are native and 17 are introduced flora species (weeds)
- one Priority 3 (P3) flora species, *Jacksonia gracillima* was identified within the proposed clearing boundary; this will be retained and protected
- one Declared Pest species, Gomphocarpus fruticosus (Narrowleaf Cottonbush)
- vegetation condition ranged from Very Good to Completely Degraded with majority of the proposed fence alignment clearing area (77.8%) being Completely Degraded
- ongoing surrounding developments, including road works along Skeet Road and Anstey Road have encroached within the proposed fencing alignment with vegetation degradation and removal/previous pruning noted
- no threatened or priority ecological communities (TEC/PEC) were identified within the survey area.

Given the nature of the proposed works, impacts to the environment are considered to be minimal. The 1 m corridor required for the installation of the fence requires minimal vegetation removal as the alignment runs along an existing fence line, adjacent to firebreaks/access tracks and road verges which are mostly in a Completely Degraded vegetative condition. Portions of the proposed clearing alignment have been impacted by development with several areas already subjected to clearing.

The proposed works will accommodate the retention of the one individual *Jacksonia gracillima* (P3). Spacing and alignment of the star-pickets will occur in a manner which does not disturb or damage the plant.

Numerous unauthorised entries and evidence of off-road vehicles utilising Anstey Keane Dampland were noted, along with illegal rubbish dumping. These activities continue to deteriorate the surrounding environment. Upgrading the existing fence will provide an additional physical barrier against anthropogenic disturbances and provide better land management through controlled access.

1.1 Location

The proposed site is located within the suburb of Forrestdale in the City of Armadale, approximately 30 km from the Perth Central Business District (Figure 1 and 2). Proposed fence line works are to occur around Bush Forever Site No. 342, running linearly along Anstey Road, Skeet Road and Ranford Road for approximately 3 km. The proposed fence is to be installed within the following lots:

- Lot 67, north-west boundary
- Lot 171, northwest and northeast boundary
- Lot 800, northeast boundary
- Lot 68, southeast boundary.


1.2 Scope

Activities undertaken by included:

- desktop database searches to identify potential conservation significant flora and fauna species,
 along with any ecological communities occurring within the proposed alignment
- a basic flora and vegetation assessment to determine vegetation condition, flora species present, including the presence of any threatened or priority species
- reporting outcomes of the assessment.

1.3 Objectives

The objective of the survey was to collect sufficient data to adequately inform a clearing permit application to the Department of Water and Environmental Regulation (DWER) under the *Environmental Protection* (Native Vegetation) Regulations 2004, ahead of the proposed fence installation.





2.0 Site Characteristics

The characteristics of a site have a strong bearing on the flora, vegetation, fauna, and ecological communities present. Key characteristics of the site are outlined in this section.

2.1 Regional Context

According to the Interim Biogeographical Regionalisation of Australia (IBRA) descriptions, the site is located within the Swan Coastal Plain. This area is described as low-lying coastal plain with sands of colluvial and aeolian origin, as well as alluvial river flats and coastal limestone. The region is dominated by *Banksia* and/or Jarrah Woodland over sandy soils associated with the dune systems, with *Melaleuca* (Paperbark) in damp areas and Jarrah Woodland to the east where the Swan Coastal Plain rises (Mitchell, Williams and Desmond, 2002).

2.2 Climate

The climate experienced in the area is Mediterranean, with dry, hot summers and cool, wet winters. According to the Bureau of Meteorology (2021); Gosnells City, Site No. 009106:


- rainfall averages 804.3 mm per annum, with rain falling predominantly between May and August
- \blacksquare maximum mean temperatures range from 18.7 °C in winter to 33 °C in summer, with a maximum recorded temperature of 46 °C
- minimum mean temperatures range from 8.8 $^{\circ}$ C in winter to 18.8 $^{\circ}$ C in summer, with a minimum recorded temperature of 0.5 $^{\circ}$ C
- predominant wind directions include morning north-easterlies and westerly sea breezes during the summer months, with an average wind speed of 9.5 km/h.


2.3 Topography and Soils

The site is relatively flat with gentle rises in the north-west and south-east boundaries, with site contours ranging from 22 to 24 m AHD (Australian Height Datum). Six soil types are present across the site (Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development, 2021) (Table 1, Figure 3, and Figure 4).

2.4 Vegetation Complex

The Southern River vegetation complex, as described by Heddle *et al.* (1980), was the only vegetation complex identified to occur within the survey area. This complex consists of Marri-Jarrah-Banksia Open Woodland on the elevated areas and a fringing Woodland of *Eucalyptus rudis, Melaleuca rhaphiophylla* along the streams. South of the Murray River, *Agonis flexuosa* occurs in association with the *Eucalyptus rudis* and *Melaleuca rhaphiophylla*.

2.5 Tenure and Current Land Use

The area is zoned by the City of Armadale as Parks and Recreation within Town Planning Scheme No. 4. The proposed fence also runs along the north, south and north-east boundaries of Anstey-Keane Dampland (Bush Forever Site 342) (Department of Planning, Lands and Heritage, 2021). Bush Forever is a strategic plan to protect regionally significant bushland on the Swan Coastal Plain within the Perth Metropolitan Region.

Anstey Keane Dampland contains high diversity of plant species and is associated with seasonal wetlands with both Conservation Category and Resource Enhancement Wetlands (Department of Biodiversity, Conservation and Attractions, 2016). It is also located within 5 km of a Wetland of International Importance (Ramsar) (Department of Agriculture, Water and the Environment, 2021).

3.0 Methodology

The basic flora survey methodologies undertaken by are described in this section.

3.1 Desktop and Literature Review

Desktop surveys were undertaken to determine:

- likely native and non-native flora and fauna species present
- current extent of native vegetation
- general floristic community types
- likely presence of threatened or priority flora species
- likely presence of any threatened or priority ecological communities.

The following databases were accessed to obtain relevant information:

- NatureMap (Department of Biodiversity, Conservation and Attractions, 2021b) (Appendix 1)
- Protected Matters Search Tool (Department of Agriculture, Water and the Environment, 2021),
 (Appendix 2)
- NationalMap to determine to determine soil types (Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development, 2021)
- FloraBase (Department of Biodiversity, Conservation and Attractions, 2021a).

3.2 On-ground Flora Survey

surveyed the site on 9

April 2021, with key GPS data recorded using Mappt software on a handheld Samsung tablet. Field activities included:

- walking the site and identifying flora species present, including targeted searches for declared rare and priority species indicated as potentially present during desktop assessments
- assessing vegetation condition across the site
- mapping of clearing pegs to indicate proposed fencing alignment
- using a GPS to map significant species and boundaries of differing vegetation conditions
- determining the presence of any further threatened or priority listed flora species and/or ecological communities listed under the *Biodiversity and Conservation Act 2016* (WA) and/or the *Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999* (Commonwealth).

Samples were collected and any unfamiliar species were recorded and photographed to enable later identification.

3.2.1 Vegetation Condition

Vegetation condition was assessed using the rating scale attributed to Keighery in *Bush Forever Volume 2* (Table 2) (Government of Western Australia, 2000).

3.3 Limitations

There are several limitations associated with both desktop and on-ground flora surveys:

- the on-ground survey was conducted outside of the optimal time of year for flora surveys in the south-west region; as such some species (e.g., orchids) would not be visible during the survey and only those observed were recorded
- database searches provide an indication of what flora species may be present, with on ground surveys required to confirm those present
- information on flora species provided on some databases include out-of-date species names, meaning that names need to be checked for currency
- herbarium records are largely limited to vouchered specimens
- plant species flower at different times and are not always able to be identified
- on-ground surveys indicate species present at the time of the assessment, with species flowering at different times not always able to be identified
- not all species flower every year
- the differing databases are reliant on information submitted via various reporting mechanisms, so all records of a particular species or ecological community within a specified area may not be complete.

4.0 Results

Both desktop and field surveys were carried out for the proposed fence replacement/installation at Anstey Keane and Skeet Road. Results of the surveys are presented in this section.

4.1 Flora Desktop Survey

A review of the NatureMap report (Department of Biodiversity, Conservation and Attractions, 2021b) (Appendix 1) indicated the potential for 547 flora species to occur within 5 km of the site, comprising:

- one hepatic (liverworts)
- three gymnosperms
- four pteridophyte (fern)
- 250 monocotyledons
- 289 dicotyledons.

4.1.1 Significant Flora Species

Of the flora species identified, NatureMap indicated the potential for 27 conservation significant flora species listed under the *Biodiversity Conservation Act 2016 (WA)* to occur within 5 km of the site (Department of Biodiversity, Conservation and Attractions, 2021b). The Protected Matters Search Tool (PMST) (Department of Agriculture, Water and the Environment, 2021) indicated the potential for 16 flora species listed as Matters of National Environmental Significance, under the *Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999* (EPBC Act) (Cwlth), to occur within a 5 km radius of the site.

4.1.2 Threatened and Priority Ecological Communities

A review of the PMST report (Department of Agriculture, Water and the Environment, 2021) (Appendix 2) indicated that three Threatened Ecological Communities (TEC) may potentially occur within the survey site, namely:

- Banksia Woodlands of the Swan Coastal Plain ecological community (Endangered)
- Clay Pans of the Swan Coastal Plain (Critically Endangered)
- Tuart (*Eucalyptus gomphocephala*) Woodlands and Forests of the Swan Coastal Plain ecological community (Critically Endangered).

4.2 Flora On-ground Survey

The survey confirmed the presence of 47 flora species from 20 families, including 30 native, 17 introduced (weeds) and one Priority 3 (P3) flora species. One Priority 3 *Jacksonia gracillima* listed under the *Biodiversity Conservation Act 2016* (WA) was recorded along the northern limits of the proposed site, near the corner of Skeet and Ranford roads (Figure 5). Photos of some of the flora species recorded on site are illustrated in Figure 6. *Gomphocarpus fruticosus* (Narrowleaf Cottonbush) was also recorded on site. This species is listed as a Declared Pest in Western Australia and landowners are required to manage its population under the *Biosecurity and Agriculture Management Act 2007* (WA).

4.2.1 Vegetation Condition

Vegetation condition across the site ranges from Completely Degraded to Very Good (Table 4, Figures 8 - 10), with the majority of the site classed as Completely Degraded as it runs along an existing fence and adjacent to firebreaks and access tracks. Numerous disturbances from adjacent roads works along Skeet Road also negatively impacted the vegetation condition (Figure 7).





4.2.2 Threatened and Priority Ecological Communities

While no TECs and/or PECs were found to be within the survey area due to the degraded nature present, the endangered Banksia Woodlands of the Swan Coastal Plain Ecological Community is known to occur in close proximity to the proposed site, along Skeet Road (Figure 11).

5.0 Implications of Results

5.1 Flora and Vegetation

As the proposed area consists of an existing fence is adjacent to a firebreak and access track, flora diversity is relatively low due to the degraded nature of the alignment. There is also substantial disturbance from neighbouring developments, including on-going road works and Western Power maintenance works, which is presented in the form of vegetation removal and ground disturbance. As a result, vegetation condition is mostly Completed Degraded as a result from these edge disturbances. Furthermore, it is noted that illegal rubbish dumping and illegal entry by off-road vehicles has deteriorated the environmental value of the Bush Forever Site.

The proposed pruning of vegetation 0.5 m on either side of the fence line, totalling approximately 0.58 ha will facilitate the installation and upgrading of the current fence. The alignment of the new fence will be installed to accommodate any mature trees within the alignment. As the proposed style of fencing includes steel cables with intermediate star-pickets and steel posts strainer assemblies, there will be minimal disturbance and impact to the surrounding areas, with star pickets and box braces driven directly into the ground, resulting in minimal soil disturbance, and limiting potential erosion. Proposed entry gates will be installed in areas with existing tracks, utilising existing cleared areas with minimal to no vegetation clearing required.

The upgrading of the fence will provide a barrier to better protect the surrounding remnant bushland from anthropogenic disturbances such as illegal off-roading and rubbish dumping which degrade the bushland. Figures 12 and 13 illustrate the various disturbances recorded during the survey.

5.2 Significant Flora

Jacksonia gracillima, a Priority 3 flora species, was recorded within the northern alignment of the survey site. This is a prostrate, spreading or scrambling shrub that typically flowers between October and November and occurs in the South-West Botanical Province, on the Swan Coastal Plain.

The proposed fence can be constructed around the one individual plant. Spacing and alignment between the fence posts can accommodate the small shrub without sacrificing its function or causing damage. Upgrading of the fence will also provide an additional physical protection against trampling and other negative anthropogenic activities.


5.3 Threatened and Priority Ecological Communities

No TECs or PECs were recorded within the 1 m wide proposed fence line alignment. The endangered Banksia Woodland of the Swan Coastal Plain ecological community is known to occur within Anstey Keane Damplands, but as it occurs outside the proposed site, is not assessed.

The presence of an existing firebreak/access track separating the site from the potential TEC, coupled with the proposed construction methodology of the fence, suggests that there will be minimal to no impact to the existing vegetation. The proposed installation of the fence will more than likely benefit the remnant vegetation by restricting access to illegal off-road vehicles and reduce rubbish dumping.





and National Importance, Commonwealth and State/Territory reserves, listed threatened, migratory and marine species and listed threatened ecological communities. Mapping of Commonwealth land is not complete at this stage. Maps have been collated from a range of sources at various resolutions.

Not all species listed under the EPBC Act have been mapped (see below) and therefore a report is a general guide only. Where available data supports mapping, the type of presence that can be determined from the data is indicated in general terms. People using this information in making a referral may need to consider the qualifications below and may need to seek and consider other information sources.

For threatened ecological communities where the distribution is well known, maps are derived from recovery plans, State vegetation maps, remote sensing imagery and other sources. Where threatened ecological community distributions are less well known, existing vegetation maps and point location data are used to produce indicative distribution maps.

Threatened, migratory and marine species distributions have been derived through a variety of methods. Where distributions are well known and if time permits, maps are derived using either thematic spatial data (i.e. vegetation, soils, geology, elevation, aspect, terrain, etc) together with point locations and described habitat; or environmental modelling (MAXENT or BIOCLIM habitat modelling) using point locations and environmental data layers.

Where very little information is available for species or large number of maps are required in a short time-frame, maps are derived either from 0.04 or 0.02 decimal degree cells; by an automated process using polygon capture techniques (static two kilometre grid cells, alpha-hull and convex hull); or captured manually or by using topographic features (national park boundaries, islands, etc). In the early stages of the distribution mapping process (1999-early 2000s) distributions were defined by degree blocks, 100K or 250K map sheets to rapidly create distribution maps. More reliable distribution mapping methods are used to update these distributions as time permits.

Only selected species covered by the following provisions of the EPBC Act have been mapped:

- migratory and
- marine

The following species and ecological communities have not been mapped and do not appear in reports produced from this database:

- threatened species listed as extinct or considered as vagrants
- some species and ecological communities that have only recently been listed
- some terrestrial species that overfly the Commonwealth marine area
- migratory species that are very widespread, vagrant, or only occur in small numbers

The following groups have been mapped, but may not cover the complete distribution of the species:

- non-threatened seabirds which have only been mapped for recorded breeding sites
- seals which have only been mapped for breeding sites near the Australian continent

Such breeding sites may be important for the protection of the Commonwealth Marine environment.
