## FORM C1

Clearing of native vegetation is prohibited in Western Australia except where a clearing permit has been granted or an exemption applies. A person who causes or allows unauthorised clearing commits an offence.

native vegetation.	The original advice received from Western Power was that we would need to clear a five metre wide by five hundred metres long strip along our northern boundary. This would have required the removal of large old growth jarrah trees. Subsequent to an onsite meeting with Western Power we have been advised that the position of the underground cable will now be adjacent to the existing firebreak/access track as this will require substantially less clearing of the existing vegetation.											
	The underground cabling will be installed by a drilling rig. By positioning this within the existing firebreak/access track we are minimising the amount of clearing required.
