	To achieve this, the post quarrying landform will involve the restoration of all non-pit areas to landscapes as similar to the surrounding sand plains and rocky low hills as possible. The quarry pit will remain as a void with abandonment bunds outside of the zone of instability. The quarry pit will remain in perpetuity, however, isolated via a permanent encircling rock bund to prevent entry.
