	Site S - During the first pass discussions with the road teams, it was proposed to widen Coramup road to 28 m, which was adjusted to 16 m to ensure a suitable width of vegetation remained within the road reserve as a fauna linkage corridor and reduce general degradation, such as erosion, dust and excessive water shedding. Likewise, the proposed 28 m width for clearing for the area along Blumann road was reduced to 22 m, which is the absolute minimum width required for clearing. Further, where feasible clearing will not occur to the full permitted width, conserving vegetation.
