LOT 48 ON PLAN 226304 (FEYSVILLE 6431) PART LOT 50 ON PLAN 226299 (FEYSVILLE 6431)

AUTHORISED ACTIVITY

1. Clearing of up to 50 hectares for the purposes of prospecting.

CONDITIONS

- 1. The Permit Holder may not clear vegetation in vegetation types 1.4, 1.5 and 4.10 as depicted in the maps that form part of this permit in Schedule 1.
- 2. Where native vegetation that is allowed to naturally regenerate in an area cleared under this permit does not result in the native vegetation in that area having similar species composition, structure and density to the pre-clearing native vegetation, the Permit Holder must revegetate the area cleared under this permit by deliberately planting or seeding native vegetation that will result in a similar species composition, structure and density of native vegetation in that area as existed prior to clearing.
- 3. The Permit Holder shall record the following for each instance of clearing: the location where clearing occurred, the coordinates of areas cleared using Geocentric Datum Australia 1994, and area cleared in hectares and any deliberate planting or seeding of native vegetation as referred to in condition 2.
- 4. The Permit Holder shall provide a report to the CEO by 31 March setting out the records required under condition 3 of this permit in relation to clearing carried out between 1 January and 31 December of the previous year.
- 5. Prior to clearing, the site shall be walked, inspected and surveyed to identify the presence of malleefowl (Leipoa ocellata) mounds.
- 6. The Permit Holder shall not clear within 50m of malleefowl mounds identified in condition 5 (Leipoa ocellata) above.
