The proposed clearing area is considered highly degraded and the vegetation had identified as mainly introduced plant species. Of the 22 flora species identified, on native flora species are present within the proposed clearing area including <i>Ficin nodosa, Lepidosperma gladiatum, Frankenia pauciflora</i> and <i>Acacia saligna</i> (Nati Area 2021) (Appendix A). Due to the condition of the vegetation present in the piclearing area and the majority of species being non-native the City did not considered there would be value in avoiding or minimising impacts to this vegetation. Further to the proposed removal of the vegetation the City will be planting a major Australian native species throughout the Youth Precinct site (Appendix B).
