Newcam is proposing to develop and operate the Mount Gould Iron Project on M52/256 in the Shire of Meekatharra, Western Australia. The tenement overlies the Mount Gould Pastoral Station. The proposed clearing will result in disturbance of 136.5 ha within a Purpose Permit Area of approximately 309.5 ha.

The Project lies wholly within the Wajarri Yamatji Native Title Determination area (WAD6033/1998). Newcam are currently waiting official registration of the Prescribed Body Corporate to manage and protect the native title rights and interests of the Native Title Claimant Group.

Newcam Minerals entered a binding agreement with ACME Mioxide in 2019 for the sale and transfer of the mining lease for an agreed sum and agreed future royalty amount upon stages of extraction of the ore body. The mining lease currently remains under ACME Mioxide ownership due to ongoing valuations of transactional stamp duty owned to the WA state revenue office. Upon final determination and payment, the mining lease will transfer into Newcam Minerals ownership. All decisions regarding the operations and management of the lease are solely made and authorised by Newcam. A record of tenure is provided in Appendix 2 of **Attachment 2**.
