

# **CLEARING PERMIT**

Granted under section 51E of the Environmental Protection Act 1986

Purpose Permit number:	9591/1
Duration of Permit:	From 09 August 2022 to 08 August 2027
Permit Holder:	LRL (AUST) Pty Ltd

The Permit Holder is authorised to clear native vegetation subject to the following conditions of this Permit.

## PART I - CLEARING AUTHORISED

- 1. Land on which clearing is to be done General Purpose Lease 36/52
  - Mining Lease 36/459 Mining Lease 36/460 Mining Lease 36/696 Miscellaneous Licence 36/255 Miscellaneous Licence 36/256

#### 2. Clearing authorised (purpose)

The Permit Holder is authorised to clear native vegetation for the purpose of mineral production and associated activities.

## 3. Area of Clearing




Figure 1: Map of the boundary of the area within which clearing may occur

The Permit Holder must not clear more than 348.2 hectares of native vegetation within the area cross-hatched yellow in Figure 1 of Schedule 1.

#### 4. Type of Clearing Authorised

The Permit Holder shall not clear native vegetation unless the purpose for which the clearing is authorised is enacted within three months of the authorised clearing being undertaken.

#### PART II - MANAGEMENT CONDITIONS

## 5. Avoid, minimise and reduce the impacts and extent of clearing

In determining the amount of native vegetation to be cleared under this Permit, the Permit Holder must apply the following principles, set out in descending order of preference:

- (a) avoid the clearing of native vegetation;
- (b) minimise the amount of native vegetation to be cleared; and
- (c) reduce the impact of clearing on any environmental value.

## 6. Weed control

- (a) When undertaking any clearing or other activity authorised under this Permit, the Permit Holder must take the following steps to minimise the risk of the introduction and spread of *weeds*:
  - (i) clean earth-moving machinery of soil and vegetation prior to entering and leaving the area to be cleared;
  - (ii) ensure that no known *weed*-affected soil, *mulch, fill* or other material is brought into the area to be cleared;
  - (iii) restrict the movement of machines and other vehicles to the limits of the areas to be cleared;
- (b) At least once in each 12 month period for the term of this Permit, the Permit Holder must remove or kill any *weeds* growing within areas cleared under this Permit.

#### 7. Vegetation Management

- (a) where practicable the Permit Holder shall avoid clearing *riparian vegetation*; and
- (b) where a *watercourse* or *drainage line* or *wetland* is to be impacted by clearing, the Permit Holder shall ensure that the existing surface flow is maintained, or reinstated downstream into existing natural *drainage lines*.

#### 8. Flora Management

Where the *priority flora* species *Grevillea inconspicua* and *Hemigenia exilis* have been identified and their written location(s), provided to the *CEO*, within the report 'MBS Environmental (MBS) (2022a) Native Vegetation Clearing Permit – Kathleen Valley Lithium – Tantalum Project. Prepared for Liontown Resources Limited. MBS Environmental, February 2022', the Permit Holder shall ensure that:

- (i) no more than 19% of individual plants of identified *Grevillea inconspicua* are cleared; and
- (ii) no individual plants of identified *Hemigenia exilis* are cleared.

## PART III - RECORD KEEPING AND REPORTING

#### 9. Records to be kept

The Permit Holder must maintain records relating to the listed relevant matters in accordance with the specifications detailed in Table 1.

## 10. Reporting

- (a) The Permit Holder shall provide a report to the CEO by 31 July each year for the life of this Permit, demonstrating adherence to all conditions of this Permit, and setting out the records required under Condition 9 of this Permit in relation to clearing carried out between 1 July and 30 June of the previous financial year.
- (b) If no clearing authorised under this Permit was undertaken between 1 July and 30 June of the previous financial year, a written report confirming that no clearing under this permit has been carried out, must be provided to the *CEO* by 31 July of each year.
- (c) Prior to 08 August 2027, the Permit Holder must provide to the CEO a written report of records required under Condition 9 of this Permit where these records have not already been provided under Condition 10(a) or 10(b) of this Permit.

## **DEFINITIONS**

In this Permit, the terms in Table 2 have the meanings defined.

The boundary of the area authorised to be cleared is shown in the map below (Figure 1).
