The clearing of native vegetation is prohibited in Western Australia unless a clearing permit has been granted for the clearing or where a permit is not required (either due to a referral determination that one is not needed or because an exemption applies). A person who causes or allows unauthorised clearing commits an offence.

	GHD did advance designs for a leachate containment pond to meet the current smaller approved disturbance footprint and the modelling showed that it only provide sufficient storage capacity for the Shire for 3-5 years, at which point the pond would risk overtopping or another pond (including more clearing) would need to be constructed. This revised design and pond sizing would ensure that there is sufficient leachate holding capacity to service the landfill to closure.
