

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



An APZ is an area of low fuel levels and managed vegetation adjacent to habitable or specified buildings and infrastructure to lessen the impact of an advancing bush fire.</p> <p>In order to comply with the Planning for Bushfire Guidelines (WAPC 2024), the maintenance of some native vegetation within the APZ will be required. Vegetation maintenance within the APZ, applicable to this clearing application, includes removal of dead vegetation and fallen dead material (0.098 ha) and the clearing of 0.003 ha of living native vegetation.</p> <p>The desktop and site assessment of the environmental values within the APZ concluded that the proposed vegetation maintenance and clearing within the APZ is not significant, as:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Removal of living vegetation has been minimised where possible, resulting in the loss of 0.003 ha of living plants</li> <li>• The proposed activities mainly comprise the clearing of dead debris (0.098 ha). Therefore, it is not considered a significant environmental impact. A review of similar referrals supports this conclusion (e.g. referrals REF 11180/1 and REF 11117/1)</li> <li>• The retention of vegetation where possible has minimised fragmentation.</li> </ul> <p>Assessment against the 10 clearing principles is provided in Section 4.3 of the supporting document and assessment against the referral requirements and criteria is provided in Section 4.4 of the supporting document.</p>
<p>Specify what the final land use will be after clearing</p>	<p>The proposed clearing is for the maintenance of the APZ. Although proposed as an APZ, the land use will not change, with 0.09 ha of native vegetation proposed to be retained and managed within the APZ.</p>

<p>Proposed method of clearing (i.e. burning, cutting, draining, flooding, grazing, mechanical clearing/bulldozing or other – specify)</p>	<p>Removal / relocation of dead material and clearing of living native vegetation within the APZ will be undertaken by hand and under the guidance of a bushfire planning consultant to ensure vegetation maintenance is in accordance with the requirements of Planning for Bushfire Guidelines (WAPC 2024), and that any pruning is undertaken in a manner that will not impact the health of vegetation.</p>

Provide the avoidance details (e.g. retention of vegetation on property)	<p>The Applicant’s consultant Bushfire Prone Planning (BPP) undertook a site assessment to identify areas of vegetation and dead material requiring removal within the APZ and those areas of native vegetation that could be retained and managed.</p> <p>The key mitigation and avoidance measures implemented by BPP to achieve acceptable bushfire risk outcomes, while protecting environmental values are summarised below:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Variation from the generic guideline requirement for a minimum 3 m vegetation separation distance was achieved through a site assessment of bushfire hazards, fuel characteristics, vegetation structure, asset vulnerability and ongoing land management practices. Variation from this setback requirement minimised the potential clearing by up to 0.01 ha</li> <li>• Implementation of performance based fuel management instead of full vegetation clearance of the APZ.</li> </ul> <p>BPP’s justification for variation from the 2024 Planning for Bushfire Guidelines is provided in further detail in Section 4.2 of the Supporting Document. BPP’s report is provided in Appendix A of the Supporting Document.</p> <p>BPP identified that 0.09 ha of native vegetation (47% of the overall APZ) could be retained and managed (i.e. through pruning) while still providing protection from bushfire. BPP states that the proposed variation from the</p>
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	prescriptive vegetation separation distances is a defensible, outcomes-based solution consistent with the 2024 Planning for Bushfire Guidelines and SPP 3.7 – Bushfire. The approach achieves acceptable bushfire risk outcomes while protecting the significant environmental values of the island.
Provide the mitigation details (e.g. management of weed spread, rehabilitation)	Implementation of a Construction Environmental Management Plan (CEMP) would reduce the risk of spread or introduction of weeds, <i>Phytophthora</i> dieback and / or erosion within the APZ. Measures outlined in the CEMP will also ensure that vehicles, equipment and machinery will be clean and free of vegetation / soil prior to being mobilised.  The retention of 0.09 ha of vegetation will minimise the risk of soil erosion.

On 16 May 2025 following a third-party referral the EPA determined the proposal was not to be assessed under part IV of the EP Act. Advice given (Not appealable).</p> <p>RPS considers that a separate clearing application, rather than an amendment to the existing clearing permit, is required for the APZ as:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- The purpose of the proposed clearing within the APZ differs to that of existing CPS 9883/1</li> <li>- The proposed clearing within the APZ is not extensive and is limited to the removal of fallen dead material (0.0.098 ha), removal of 0.003 ha of living vegetation and pruning required to comply with relevant guidelines</li> <li>- The impacts from the proposed clearing within the APZ differ to those within the CPS 9883/1, as summarised below:             <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. Due to the retention of vegetation where possible, and relocation of dead material, impacts to fauna and fauna habitat are not considered of material consequence. The proposed vegetation maintenance will not result in significant fragmentation of habitat, as detailed further in the assessment against the 10 clearing principles (Section 4.3)</li> <li>b. There is 0.18 ha of a threatened ecological community (TEC) mapped within the APZ. A further 44.39 ha of vegetation analogous with the TEC was recorded proximate to the APZ. Impacts to the TEC within the APZ comprises 0.2% of the TEC recorded by FVC (2025) proximate to the APZ.</li> </ol> </li> </ul> <p>Further details on the proposed clearing of up to 0.1 ha (0.098 ha dead debris and 0.003 ha of living vegetation) is provided in the Supporting Document which concludes that the proposed vegetation maintenance and clearing within the APZ is not significant, as:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Vegetation has been retained where possible, minimising fragmentation</li> <li>- No formal ecological linkages have been identified</li> </ul>
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		<p>within the APZ. Vegetation to the south of Brand Way comprises vegetation forming a local ecological linkage. Although separated from this linkage by Brand Way, there may be some movement between the vegetation within the APZ and this linkage. Due to the retention of stands of native vegetation throughout the APZ, movement of fauna through this area will not be impacted</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Removal of living vegetation has been minimised where possible, resulting in the loss of 0.003 ha</li> <li>- The retention of patches of vegetation throughout the APZ will minimise the risk of erosion</li> <li>- Vegetation removal and maintenance within the TEC is limited to:             <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>I. The relocation or removal of dead debris and vegetation (0.09 ha of the TEC)</li> <li>II. Clearing 0.003 ha of living native vegetation comprising the TEC</li> <li>III. The retention of 0.09 ha of vegetation comprising the TEC.
